From the Directors...

As Winter approaches, pasture quality and the importance of animal supplements becomes a major focus.

Many customers have experienced outstanding results using our animal supplements or Natra Min yet their successes are never documented. Sometimes customers are reluctant to share their 'good news' as the results achieved are difficult to quantify. For example, a farmer recently recalled how when ploughing, birds were following his tractor in pursuit of worms, something he hadn't witnessed for many years.

Such information is invaluable to us, and we are extremely thankful to farmers who share their experiences as so often this information can be used to help other farmers facing similar challenges.

Perhaps the most consistent feedback we receive regarding Natra Min is the improvement in soil structure that occurs following its use. As one farmer reported "when ploughing, it feels like the plough jumps out of the ground when I go from a non treated area to an area where Natra Min has been used" and another... "water no longer sits on top of the ground anymore, but soaks into the ground."

And whilst we are reluctant to make claims that Superior Mineral Supplement is a cure for scours, farmers regularly report that since using it, the white scours in calves have ceased. Other anecdotal 'evidence' regarding the use of Superior Mineral Supplement remains consistent... with stronger cycling and better utilization of dry feed a common theme.

Is Super Phosphate still working for you?

In the photographs below, both paddocks were planted with an identical pasture mix of Rye, Clover, Phalaris and Cocksfoot. Initially the growth was similar, however during the hot dry conditions it was obvious that the pasture performed much better in the area that was treated with Natra Min HI-Phos.





Many farmers tell us that Super does not give them the results that they used to get. Contrary to the belief held by some farmers that the quality of Super Phosphate has changed, we believe that the change is in the soil.

In particular, the depletion of microbe and worm activity in the soil has reduced the effectiveness of applied fertilizer as well as having a strong impact on soil pH and subsequently, the availability of all plant nutrients.

Do you have a phosphate bank in your soil?

If you have used phosphate fertilizer in the past, then the answer to that question is probably "YES"

CSIRO Research...

"It is thought that at best, just 20% of phosphorus applied by way of fertilizer is available for plant uptake in the year it is applied. Successive generations of Australian farmers have applied huge quantities of phosphorus fertilizer to combat the problem of chronic phosphorus deficiency in their soil. This has led to a massive bank of fixed phosphorus, estimated at close to \$10 billion at current Super Phosphate prices."

"This means, that of the dollars spent applying phosphate fertilizer at the rate of 250kg per hectare (about 22.5kg of phosphorus) often just one tenth of this phosphorus (2.25kg) is immediately available to plants." (Source CSIRO article, Raiding the Phosphate Bank, 1997.)

In separate research carried out by Cooperative Research Centre for Soil & Land Management, it was found that the application of high levels of fertilizer can reduce the effectiveness of soil organisms, thus further reducing nutrient availability. For example, high N inputs reduce Nitrogen fixation and high P inputs reduce beneficial effects of mycorrhizae (VAM).

How big is the phosphate bank?

"It is thought that each hectare of soil may hold up to 400kg of phosphorus, with less than 4kg immediately available to crops or pasture." (Source CSIRO article, Raiding the Phosphate Bank, 1997.)

Time for change...

Many farmers are making the change to Natra Min as a means to provide a balance in soil nutrition and to stimulate the life in the soil, assisting to increase the availability of locked up nutrients. (More information over page)

Tenterfield graziers discover "key" to unlock soil's nutrients

Well known Tenterfield graziers, brothers Ray and Kelvin Pitkin, have discovered an economical and effective alternative to Super Phosphate.

For several years the Pitkins sought a suitable substitute to Super Phosphate that would deliver improved pasture growth and response. After decades of farming, and hindered by several seasons of poor rainfall, Ray admits their decision to review their choice of input was influenced by their dependence on an ever increasing amount of water-soluble fertilizer without increased results.

Double application of Super... but not double results...

As Ray explains, "Dad started to apply Super on our paddocks up in the mountain years ago, applying 12 - 15 tonne initially. Over the last 10 years Kelvin and I had almost doubled the application of Super, up to 26 tonne over the same paddocks... and yet we still weren't getting the response we expected.

We have noticed less and less clover and some grass species had disappeared altogether."

That is when they heard about Natra Min... five different blends of broad-spectrum fertilizer, designed to restore the soil's nutrients by stimulating microbial activity, helping to 'unlock' stored elements such as Phosphorous to increase its availability to plants.

Based on soil test results, and considering the amount of Super previously applied, Ray and Kelvin applied Natra Min Cal-S in a bid to release the Phosphorus bank in their soil.

Return of Clover & Medics...

"We aerial spread about 30 tonne of Natra Min and the response has been very impressive. Up on the mountain, the paddocks had been through a hard time, but since applying Natra Min the pastures seem to have held on better in the dry compared to when we applied Super."

Another beneficial effect has been the return of clovers and medics that look impressive, standing knee high as well as an improved 'durability' to the pasture. "The pasture certainly seems a lot softer with better grasses and clover. We've fattened bullocks and turned them off before Christmas and two weeks later you wouldn't know they'd been in the paddock."

The return of legumes to this country is a huge advantage in terms of improving the protein content of the pasture and supplying a source of Nitrogen to the soil and grasses.

Natra Min: Cost Effective alternative...

As Ray adds, "For a similar cost to using Super, Natra Min has provided better results, with increased pasture density and growth."

Rob highlights that nutrition plays a key role in maintaining high conception rates in mature females... "I'm mindful of the need to increase conception rates with Brahman females so we need to operate and maintain above 85% conception rates in these herds".

Rob runs a 'spike' feeding program with Mega Minerals prior to mating and recognizes the importance of phosphorous supplements on his northern properties.

Mega Minerals provides both phosphorous and a broad spectrum of other minerals and trace elements. By supplementing heifers with Mega Minerals to improve their condition and growth, Rob runs a yearling mating program.

"We've had outstanding results since using the Mega Minerals Lick Blocks. Conception rates have increased and we find that these supplements provide a tremendous maintenance source for our breeders. We're achieving up to 93% conception rates which means clients are happy."

Supplementing in good times....

Rob Newcombe believes that supplementing animals during periods of good pasture growth is also vital. "I prefer the Mega Minerals Lick Blocks as they have enough molasses to assist with intake in better seasons when we find cattle won't take other phosphorous sources... and they're still getting the broad spectrum of minerals and trace elements."

... and bad times.

According to Rob, "in hard times, like the seasons we've been having, you need to supplement or you won't have a business. We don't aim to put on condition when it's really bad but if we maintain their condition when it's dry, cattle improve faster when the season changes. Supplementing with Mega Minerals also assists with conception in dry times which means clients will still have calves on the ground next year".

Aid for Embryo Transplant Program...

Rob overseas an extensive ET program and the importance of supplementing recipients as well as the donor cow is recognised. "At least a 72% conception with recipients has been achieved using Mega Minerals. In one program where Mega Minerals were not used, only 2 out of 15 embryos held. I believe that the broad spectrum of minerals including silica are all important elements for ET programs... another reason I prefer the Mega Minerals Lick Block."

Mega Minerals suitable for all livestock...
